She is also a Fellow of the Asian Bureau of Finance and Economic Research (ABFER) and a Lee Kong Chian Fellow. She graduated with a PhD in Economics from the University of Michigan. Pao-Li has published in renowned journals such as *International Economic Review*, *Journal of International Economics*, *Journal of Development Economics*, *Econometrics Journal*, and *Mathematical Social Sciences*. She has also worked as a consultant for the United Nations Secretariat and the Boston Consulting Group on trade-related projects, and served as referees for many well-known economics journals. She was awarded research excellence and teaching excellence awards from SMU.
